This session has been a huge success! The bands have grown more - we have about 37 in the Harmony Lakeshore Band and 39 in the Lakeshore Winds. Several new experienced players have joined us from Oshawa, Whitby, Courtice, Port Perry and Orono.

Our organization was given 40 or 50 new band arrangements by the Durham Wind Ensemble and Bowmanville High School. Dozens of band arrangements were also purchased and donated by our own band members. As a result we have lots of music to choose from. It is actually hard to decide what to do first! Both bands are playing more challenging music this year. Our instrumentation is fairly well balanced (although nine saxophones is a bit much...). How wonderful to have a bassoon!

I hope that our players will encourage family and friends to come out to our public Christmas concert at Faith United Church on Dec. 16 at 7:30pm. Each of the bands will also be entertaining the residents of Durham Christian Homes and Hillsdale Estates.

The Saxophone Ensemble will be performing at a church service for Rehoboth Church at 10am on December 9. They will be playing about a dozen Christmas Carols. We named this group "Never Enough Sax" last year but are currently trying to come up with a more appropriate name that could be used in church. Any ideas?





After retiring in 1997 I began taking violin lessons and achieved Grade 4 from the Royal Conservatory of Music. It is my feeling that the violin is the most versatile and beautiful sounding instrument created.
